Parents in Partnership Committee

In 2023, Swan Christian College launched the Parents in Partnership Committee, which will comprise of parents acting as Class Representatives. A parent from each class can nominate themselves or someone else as a Class Rep for the year, with the teachers and Leadership making the final choice of Class Representative.

This role will have 1-year tenure.

Class Representatives will work with the College, teachers and other parents in various ways, helping out at College events, fundraising events, and school or community events. The Class Representative will be encouraged to organise regular social events for the class members and their families.

The role is beneficial as it keeps open lines of communication and strengthens our community.

The Class Representatives meet with the Principal and Junior School Leadership team once per term to discuss the activities happening within the class community and explore strategies to build and strengthen the College community.



Getting to the College

Swan Christian College is situated in metropolitan Perth at the gateway to the picturesque Swan Valley.

In close proximity to the Great Northern/Reid/Roe Highway intersection, Swan is very accessible to parents who wish to drive their children to and from the College. Swan is also serviced by several Transperth and private buses, making it easy for students to travel to and from school via bus and train.

Parking

Students being driven to and from the College may only be dropped off and picked up in the designated drop-off areas. Cars must not be left unattended in the drop off zones in the car park. Please observe all “No Parking” and “No Standing” signs and please note that there is strictly no stopping or parking at any time on Great Northern Highway (Shire fines apply).

When driving on College grounds, speed limits need to be carefully observed at all times, in particular near the pedestrian crossings.

Members of staff are assigned to the pedestrian crossings in front of the Junior School campus and the Senior School campus. Parents and students need to obey the directions of staff when crossing the road.

Public Transport

The College is serviced by several Transperth buses, School Bus Service buses (SBS) and private buses.

To make the transition to public transport options as easy and safe as possible, Transperth has put together a website which contains everything that parents need to know to help make your child’s move to independent travel as simple and stress-free as possible. Please visit getonboard.transperth.wa.gov.au to access these resources.

Students are expected to behave in a courteous and responsible manner when travelling on buses. For their safety, students are expected to take the most

direct bus route and the earliest available connection. Students are held accountable for their behaviour while travelling unaccompanied to and from the College.

Transperth Buses and Smartrider

Senior School students will be given the opportunity to apply for a Smartrider card during their induction or on one of their first days of school.

Junior School students can be issued with a Smartrider by visiting monitorwa.com.au/smartrider/

It is advised to plan your school route no more than two weeks out from the start of the gazetted school term using the Transperth Journey Planner at www.transperth.wa.gov.au/Journey-Planner. Services often change at the start of the school year. Journey planning less than two weeks out ensures you receive the most up-to-date information.



School Bus Services

The Government of Western Australia has been providing Transport Assistance to Western Australian families for more than 80 years. The size of our state dictates that many families live great distances from their local school. School Bus Services (SBS) relieves the burden on these families by providing free transport to eligible students to and from their nearest appropriate school.

SBS also provides orange school bus services for students with special needs.

If your child resides outside of the designated Public Transport Area, you might be eligible to apply for SBS transport assistance.

Student Services

Our Student Services team manages absentees and the sign in/sign out process for students arriving to school late or having to leave early.

Attendance and Absentees

Parents are required to inform the College of every absence and provide reasonable explanations for it.

One off Absence

Once the Mentor Group and Period 1 rolls have been taken (on a Friday Mentor Group and Period 2) an SMS will be sent to any parents who have not yet notified Student Services of an absence. Parents are expected to reply to this message as soon as possible. By 12:30pm, phone calls will be made to parents/guardians of any students still unaccounted for to ensure the safety of the student. This includes trying all parents, guardians, and emergency contacts listed until the child can be accounted for. Parents/

guardians are still required to contact Student Services even if they are arriving to school late via an appointment or similar so that all periods absent may be accounted for.

Extended Absence

If a student is going to be away from school for a period longer than three days, parents must advise the Principal by emailing Student Services at studentservices@swan.wa.edu.au at least a week prior to going so that the Principal may approve the absence before it takes place.

Early Pickup

If a student is to be collected early by a parent/guardian, the parent/guardian must present to Student Services and sign their child out before leaving the school with their child. If you know that you will be collecting your child early from school, please provide a note or send an email to Student Services and/or your



child's teacher to arrange for the child to be waiting for you in Student Services at the time of collection. If a student is going to be collected by anyone other than a parent/guardian please ensure you have notified Student Services in writing (SMS or email) of who will be collecting your child.

Arriving late

If your child is arriving after 8:45am please notify Student Services before 8:30am. Students who arrive after 8:30am for Junior School and 8:40am for Senior School will need to be signed in to Student Services when they arrive. If you have previously advised Student Services that they will be arriving late, a parent does not need to accompany their child to sign in.

Educational Support

Our Inclusive Education team together with our team of counsellors, chaplains and psychologists, ensures that every individual student is provided with the highest level of support. Please assist the College in addressing the diversity in student learning by providing our team with all the necessary information applicable to your child.

Pastoral Care and Wellbeing

We work diligently to create a safe and nurturing environment providing students the opportunity to flourish. All staff members provide pastoral care and ensure the provision of proactive and reactive support measures address the holistic wellbeing of each student.

Our wellbeing program *Living Well* focuses on our students' holistic development, beyond the traditional core curriculum. The program includes peer support, team building, leadership and resilience training, online safety and mental health education. The aim of the program is to equip students to flourish and achieve outstanding results, during their schooling life and beyond.

Understanding our place in creation cannot be achieved without acknowledging we are beings created in God's image. The most essential question

a person can seek to answer is therefore not 'who am I?' or 'what am I?', but 'whose am I?'.

The Bible affirms each of the following elements in our understanding of humanity, which together form the basis of all wellbeing programs at Swan Christian College.

We understand people to be:

- Physical – we have physical bodies that need nurturing, strengthening and training.
- Emotional – we are psychological beings with high levels of self-

awareness. Our emotional experiences are just as real as our physical ones.

- Social – we are members of social networks of varying complexity and require positive, encouraging and supportive relationships.
- Mental – we have the faculties and intellectual capacity for growth and creativity.
- Spiritual – we have a fundamental need for relationship with God, the source of true life.



Junior School

In the Junior School, the classroom teacher is best placed to provide the care and support needed at school. The Junior School Chaplain and College Psychologist are available to provide specialist support to the classroom teacher where needed, and provide services including early intervention programs, psychological testing and referrals to external providers.

The Deputy Head and Head of Junior School, along with the Head of Inclusive Learning, are members of the Junior School Pastoral Care Team and assist the classroom teacher by monitoring academic progress, counselling in the development of individual learning plans and responding to other individual needs as they arise.

Senior School

The Mentor Group and Mentor Teacher are important elements of stability and support for students in their journey through Senior School. A specialist group of staff are specifically chosen to work with the Dean of Year 7 to assist students in their significant year of transition into the secondary years.

The relationship with the Mentor Teacher is central to the provision of pastoral care from Year 7 through to Year 12. Pastoral care for each group is overseen by a Dean of Year and the Head of Wellbeing, who together with the Inclusive Education Coordinator, Chaplain and College Psychologist provide specialist support as required.

The Dean of Year will listen, encourage and support students on their journey through Senior School.

Using a coaching philosophy, they inspire and empower the students to take responsibility for their own decisions and ensure that every individual student is provided with the highest level of support.



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College Houses

Students will be allocated to a House upon entry into the College.

The House system will provide a support structure for pastoral care, sporting and cultural activities within the life of the College.

When a student accepts membership of a College team, group or society, he or she accepts all the commitments involved in that membership, for not to do so is a mark of little respect towards the other members of the group concerned.

The Houses at Swan Christian College are: Bell, Bennett, Kennedy, Mungulu and Shenton.

These Houses operate through sporting and cultural activities. Each House is coordinated by the House Coordinator and House Captains.

House Carnivals and Competitions

Sports carnivals are organised at a House level and an interschool level. These are considered important events in the College calendar and participation in these is an honour. Attendance is compulsory at House Carnivals. Each House selects its competitors through competition before the

Interhouse competition. Other activities, such as fun-runs, lunchtime debating, drama and chess competitions are organised on a House basis.

History of the College House Names

The names of our Houses, Bell, Bennett, Kennedy, Mungulu and Shenton come from important Christian leaders in Western Australia's history.

Music Tuition and Ensembles

All students are warmly invited and encouraged to get involved in the opportunities offered at Swan Christian College by the Music Department.

Instrumental Music Lessons

Students from any year level are welcome to apply for instrumental music lessons. These lessons are offered on all common instruments and are delivered by our team of dedicated tutors who specialise on their instrument.

Lessons are 30 minutes per week and students come out of regular classes to attend. These instrumental lessons rotate weekly, so students are not missing the same subject each week for their music lesson.

Lessons are available as individual lessons or group lessons of two or three students. Tutors bill parents directly.

All students taking instrumental lessons through the school must belong to a school performing group appropriate for their instrument.

Performing Ensembles

Students are welcome to join the following groups assuming they have the necessary skills:

Choirs

The various College choirs sing a varied repertoire of songs from current hits to more traditional songs. The choirs perform at most formal College events as well as concerts and numerous special events. Everyone is welcome to come join the fun of singing in a choir.

Praise Crew (Yr 7-9)

Praise Crew is a worship band that learns current worship songs and leads the school when worship needs to rock!



String Ensemble (Junior: Yr 4-6, Senior: Yr 7-12)

Students who learn either violin, viola, cello or double bass are very welcome to join the string ensemble. This group plays music from Pirates of the Caribbean to Purcell and everything in between.

Blast Off Band (Yr 5)

Blast Off Band is our introductory program to playing in a concert band. After a semester of lessons and band rehearsals students perform a concert. They are then encouraged to continue with lessons on their chosen instrument at their own expense.

Drum Corps (Yr 5-7, Yr 8-12)

The Drum Corp is a band of drummers that come into their own at school special events. They are often used to march

students in or out when the occasion calls for something extra special.

Jazz Band

The Jazz Band is for more experienced wind, brass and rhythm section players (guitar, piano, bass or drums). Places are limited to this group that plays a variety of jazz and popular styles.

Swan Concert Band (Yr 7-12)

The Concert Band is for all students who learn a woodwind, brass or percussion instrument. Playing a variety of musical styles, the band plays at many school events.

Guitar Ensemble (Yr 7-9)

The guitar ensemble is open to all guitarists having lessons and plays pieces in a variety of modern and rock styles.



Extracurricular Activities

With a cohort of around 1600 students from Kindergarten to Year 12, the College's extracurricular programs are wide and varied.

Programs evolve depending on the group of students enrolled at the time, giving our students flexible extracurricular programs that meet their needs.

The extracurricular program includes sporting activities, chess club, music, orchestra, bands, choirs, fitness club, Lego League, tutoring, language clubs, and much more.

The program encourages our students to engage with their community so that when they leave in Year 12 they have grown into active, confident young men and women with the world as their oyster.

Extracurricular Planner

Fenceline Theatre

Fenceline Theatre Company is Swan Christian College's school-based theatre that operates under the premise of creating 'space for students to create'.

The award winning theatre company under the leadership of Fenceline Theatre Company Director, Jane Hille provides students, Alumni, parents, staff and the community with the opportunity to gain professional theatre experience.

Lockers

The lockers are designed for storage of items during the day only and the College accepts no responsibility for items left overnight or during holidays.

BYOD (Bring your Own Device) Storage Lockers

These lockers, situated in the gym, are specifically designed for the storage of devices only. A limited number of powered lockers are also available for hire which enable stored devices to be charged during breaks.

Storage Lockers

Lockers are situated at the rear of M Block and are of a size that can easily accommodate books and school sports bags.

Phone Lockers

Phone lockers are mandatory for students in Years 7–10. Students must store their phones in their assigned lockers upon arriving on campus in the morning and keep them there until the final class of the day.

If your child does not own a phone, please notify their Dean of Year, and the locker levy will be credited to your account.

Students will need to use cash or an EFTPOS card for transactions while on campus.

Locker Applications

Locker application forms are available from Student Services. Lockers can be hired for the entire school year or part of it, but the hire fee is non-refundable once paid. Since lockers are limited, applications are processed on a first-come, first-served basis.

Storage lockers:
